Minister's Message

As I write, it is Ascension Day, a reminder of the time when Jesus returned to the Father in heaven. As he met in person with his disciples one last time, he said to them, 'you will receive power when my Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth' (Acts 1:8).

Today, Jesus still says to his followers, 'You will be my witnesses'! For one or two of us, that may mean going to faraway places with the good news of God's love for all. For all of us, I suggest, it does mean sharing that love in our local communities: our workplaces, our friendship networks, our homes.

During 'Thy Kingdom Come' (Ascension to Pentecost), we are called to pray for '5' whom we know to come closer to Christ. The problem for many – perhaps, all – of us is that we doubt that our prayers will make any difference. We look at those for whom we pray, and they seem as far away from God as ever. Is there any point?

I'm reminded of the boy who brought his '5' to Jesus (John 6:1-13). For him, it was five loaves (and two fish). But what difference would they make to the crowd of



5000 that was hungry and had no food? Then Jesus did much with the little that the boy brought. All were fed and satisfied! We may have little faith, and struggle to believe that our family, friends and colleagues could ever come to know Christ. God wants us to bring our little faith and seemingly inadequate prayers to him. And he is able to do immeasurably more than all we can ask and imagine (Ephesians 3:20-21).

I encourage us all to pray for our '5', not just for 10 days but for as long as it takes. May God increase our expectation and answer our prayers – 'to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.'



Mission of the Month: BMS World Mission



BMS (Baptist Missionary Society) is working in over 30 countries on four continents to help people experience fullness of life in Jesus Christ.

Although less involved now, it's been my privilege to work with BMS since about 1999, as a member of the Candidate Board and as a Trustee. I was also able to visit BMS projects in Nepal and DR Congo in 2003 & 2009.

As a church, we give towards the work of BMS World Mission. It's important that we also pray.

BMS World Mission supporters deliver practical help to people in desperate circumstances in some of the world's most materially deprived places. By providing pathways to education, flourishing livelihoods and good healthcare for those with the fewest opportunities, you tackle injustice and suffering, and bring hope to the world.

Through partnerships with established and trusted local agencies, we can do more together than we ever could alone. Pray for our partner in Nepal, the Multipurpose Community Development Service, which comes alongside villages to improve all aspects of life.

We also work with local churches who are best placed to bring long-term community transformation. Pray for Louise and Peter Lynch in Bangladesh and their work with the Bangladesh Baptist Church Sangha, responding in communities where the need is greatest.

One of the ways we tackle injustice and suffering is by sending skilled mission workers to the world's poorest countries. Pray for the work of Andrea and Mark Hotchkin at an understaffed, underfunded hospital in Bardaï, northern Chad.
