

#### An Elder's Reflection

As you will now be aware, I am stepping down from my role as an Elder at the AGM this month. This is my second period of being an Elder at Well Street United Church – the first time our boys were very young and it was a juggling act on Sundays especially, as at that time we had three services to look after and be present at, as well as monthly evening meetings (which I took as an opportunity to get out of the bedtime routine!)

However I do look back on this period as a real blessing — needing to be at the then 11am service meant I got to know church members who I would not have necessarily come into contact with as a young mum, and was pushed out of my comfort zone with the need to pray with the minister and up front at the start of the service. During this time I felt my spiritual life developing as without God giving me the confidence I needed I would have been a very different Elder.

I have always felt that as a member of a church family it is important to give as well as receive, and to play a part in the life of the church. It is easy to sit on a Sunday and receive – from the music, prayers and preaching. At some point that receiving should turn to action – both within and outside the church – for us to be Jesus' hands and feet on earth.

It is only when one gets involved in the running of the church that one appreciates how much time is given up by church family members. As a church we regularly run First Steps, Explorers, Renew café, Cameo, a very committed Pastoral Team, Worship at Lace Hill residential home, monthly Prayer and Praise, along with our regular Sunday services and one off events throughout the year (and I am sorry if I have missed anything out from this list). None of these activities happen without individuals committing themselves to make them happen.

Behind all these activities is prayer – so even if you are unable to help physically with these groups you can support them in your prayers.

All these activities are witnessing in our local community. If we want to become a Missional Community as Rev Stuart Dyer spoke about on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> October (and if you missed him speak, the audio recording is on the church website), we need to be looking at how we reach out to those who need to hear of the love of God for themselves as an individual. This will mean different things to different people, and we need to meet people where they are and with the needs they have. Surely the basis of all our lives should be John's words "My command is this: love each other as I have loved you." John 15v12.

Once I step down as an Elder, I hope that I will find ways to continue to serve you and the community as a member of this amazing church family.
